The Student Right to Know and Campus Security Act

was signed into law in November 1990. Title II of this Act is known as the Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act.

This Act requires institutions participating in student financial aid programs under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 to disclose

information about campus safety policies and procedures and to provide statistics concerning certain crimes that occurred on campus. In compliance with the act, Antioch University Midwest publishes and distributes this information by October 15th of each year in our Campus Security Report.

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Federal law requires universities to annually inform students and employees about its safety programs and crime statistics.

- Information regarding security of and access to campus facilities and security issues in the facility's maintenance;
- Emergency response and evacuation policy and procedures;
- Current law enforcement policies, including the authority of security personnel, the relationship with municipal law enforcement departments and policies encouraging the reporting of crimes;
- A description of the type and frequency of programs to inform the campus community about security procedures;
- A description of crime prevention programs;
- Campus policy on the possession, use and sale of alcohol and illegal drugs;
- A description of drug or alcohol abuse education programs;
- A description of programming aimed at the prevention of sex offenses and procedures to follow when a sex offense occurs and the list of sanctions that may be imposed; and
- Statistics on the reports of certain crimes and arrests;

In the event of an emergency, contact 9-1-1.

Any suspicious activity or persons seen in the parking lots or loitering around vehicles or inside the Antioch Midwest building should be reported to the Yellow Springs Police Department at (937) 767-7202.

Other individuals who may receive a report of a crime: Any crime reported to the Campus Security Officer is shared with local law enforcement. A crime victim's identity is a required component of this report; however, this identity will not be shared with anyone other than those charged with investigating and/or prosecuting the criminal action.

Timely Warnings:

In the event that a situation arises, either on campus or off, that, in the judgment of the Campus Security Officer, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus-wide "timely warning" will be issued. The warning will be issued through the posting in area student lounges and via the AUM email system to all students, faculty and staff.

Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the Campus Security Officer, Darlene Robertson, at (937) 769-1824 or in person in the Student Services Conference Room, Room D122.

Voluntary Confidential Reporting:

If you are a victim of or witness to any crime on or near the Antioch University Midwest campus, you are obligated to report the incident promptly to the Campus Security Officer. Because the reports are public records under state law, the Campus Security Office cannot hold reports of crime in confidence. With such information, the University can keep accurate records of the number of incidents involving students, determine whether there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant, and alert the campus community to potential danger.

II. Policy on the Preparation and Dissemination of the Crime Report

The Office of Student and Administrative Services prepares this report annually to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The full text of this report can be located on our web site at https://midwest.antioch.edu/about/campus_safety. This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our campus facility at 900 Dayton Street in Yellow Springs, Ohio and with the Office of Student and Administrative Services.

Campus crime, arrest and referral statistics include those reported to the Campus Security Officer, other campus individuals, or the Yellow Springs Police Department. These statistics may also include crimes that have occurred in private residences or businesses and is not required by law.

Each year an email notification is made to all enrolled students providing the web site to access this report. Faculty and staff receive similar electronic notification. Copies of the report may be obtained by contacting Darlene Robertson, Campus Security Officer and Vice President of Finance and Administration, by calling (937) 769-1824 or by emailing a request to drobotson@antioch.edu. All prospective students and employees may obtain a copy of this report from Ms. Robertson or by contacting Human Resources at (937) 769-1373.

III. Emergency Response and Evacuation Policy and Procedures

Students and employees of Antioch University Midwest are required to notify the campus security personnel of any significant emergency that may pose an immediate threat to the health or safety of students and/or employees on campus.

Security personnel at Antioch University Midwest include Darlene Robertson, Vice President for Finance and Administration; Jennifer Priskorn, Executive Assistant, Office of the President; Michael Fishbein, President.

The President or designee will determine if a serious crime, natural disaster, or other emergency poses an immediate threat to the health and/or safety of students and/or employees. If there is such a threat, Antioch University Midwest will immediately notify those who may be affected by the situation.

The President or designee will, without delay, determine the contents of the notification and who will be so notified. If the President determines that immediate notification would significantly compromise the response or assistance efforts, the President may delay notification. In all other instances, the President or designee will immediately activate the notification system.

Antioch University Midwest uses the following systems for communicating information quickly to the campus community: network email; public address system; website; and in-person notification. Some or all of these methods of communication may be used in the event of an immediate threat to students and/or employees.

Antioch University Midwest will test the emergency response and evacuation procedures on at least an annual basis using announced or unannounced tests. For each test, the description of the exercise, date, time, and whether it was announced or not will be documented. During such testing, Antioch University Midwest will publicize its emergency response and evacuation procedures.

IV Information regarding security of and access to campus facilities and security issues in the facility's maintenance.

During business hours of 8:30 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. during the week, 7:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays (and occasional Sundays when classes are being held), Antioch University Midwest will be open to students, employees, contractors and guests. During non-business hours, access to all Antioch facilities is by key, if issued, or by admittance via the facilities staff. In the case of periods of extended closing, Antioch will admit only those with prior written approval to the campus building. Entrances to the building, as well as public areas of the facility, are monitored continuously with security video cameras.

Emergencies may necessitate changes or alterations to any posted schedules.

As Antioch University Midwest has no residential facilities, we do not maintain a missing student notification policy, nor are we required to have separate policies regarding access to campus residences.

AUM's facilities' staff members maintain the security of the facility by clearing the pathways and parking lots of snow and debris, monitoring the lighting of the parking lots, and ensuring the operation of the "blue-light" emergency phones at the building's north entrance and in the parking lot that enable a caller to issue an immediate call for assistance to the Yellow Springs Police Department.

Weather and School Closing Policy: Antioch University Midwest follows clearly-defined procedures for deciding on school closing based on weather conditions. These procedures are detailed in the Weather and School Closing Policy on the AUM website:

Tornado Information:

The hallway of the first floor of the north end of the building, between rooms A146 and A133, has been designated a Tornado Safe Zone. In the event of a tornado warning, all individuals currently in the building will be directed to proceed to this hallway for maximum protection. Individuals will be notified when it is safe to leave this zone.

Fire Safety:

In the event of a suspected or actual fire in the building, all individuals currently in the building will be directed to exit, closing doors behind them, and proceed to the parking lot. Individuals should gather at the end of the lot farthest from the building, and await the signal to return to the building or for dismissal.

Periodic fire and tornado safety drills take place without prior notice.

V. Current law enforcement policies, including the authority of security personnel and policies encouraging the reporting of crimes.

Antioch University Midwest security personnel include the Vice President for Finance and Administration, Executive Assistant, Office of the President and President. Antioch University Midwest security personnel have the authority to detain and question an individual and to require his/her departure and/or exclusion from campus property. Antioch University Midwest works cooperatively with the Yellow Springs Police Department pursuant to a Memorandum of Understanding and, as necessary, with the Ohio State Police. Antioch University Midwest encourages strongly all students and employees to accurately and promptly report any suspected crime to security personnel and appropriate law enforcement agencies.

VI. A description of the type and frequency of programs to inform the campus community about security and safety procedures

On an annual basis, students and employees receive information regarding crime on campus, campus safety and security information and contacts, and crime prevention resources. Periodically, crime awareness and prevention programs may be offered.

When time is of the essence, security information is released to the university community through security alerts posted prominently throughout campus and through information sent over the university's electronic mail system and institutional website (<https://midwest.antioch.edu>).

VII. Antioch University Midwest policy on the possession, use and sale of alcohol and illegal drugs

The possession, sale, or the furnishing of alcohol or illegal drugs on the University campus is governed by Antioch University Midwest Drug and Alcohol Policy and Ohio State Law. However, the enforcement of alcohol and illegal substance laws on-campus is primarily the responsibility of the Yellow Springs Police Dept. Antioch's campus has been designated "drug free" and only under certain circumstances is the consumption of alcohol permitted. The possession, sale, manufacture or distribution of any controlled substance is illegal under both state and federal laws.

It is unlawful to sell, furnish or provide alcohol to a person under the age of 21. The possession of alcohol by anyone under the age of 21 in a public place or a place open to the public is illegal. It is also a violation of the Antioch University Midwest Drug and Alcohol Policy for anyone to consume or possess alcohol in any public or private area of campus without prior University approval. Such laws are strictly enforced by Antioch and by the Yellow Springs Police Department. Violators may be subject to criminal prosecution, fines and imprisonment. In addition, organizations or groups violating the drug and alcohol policies or laws may be subject to sanctions by the University.

VIII. A description of drug or alcohol abuse education programs

Antioch University Midwest offers a student health insurance policy through United Healthcare available to all registered students taking 6 or more credit hours in any given term (see <https://www.uhcsr.com/mcgregor> for details). This policy covers treatment services for drug and alcohol abuse. Insurance policies available to employees of Antioch University include coverage for drug and alcohol abuse as well. All benefit-eligible employees, including those who do not participate in University insurance plans, are eligible for support for substance abuse through the institution's Employee Assistance Program (EAP). LOCAL, STATE & FEDERAL LEGAL SANCTIONS

Legal Sanctions – Laws Governing Alcohol

The State of Ohio sets 21 as the minimum age to purchase or possess any alcoholic beverage. Specific ordinances regarding violations of alcohol laws, including driving while intoxicated, are available from the campus security officer, Darlene Robertson, or from the Yellow Springs Police Department

A violation of any law regarding alcohol is also a violation of the AUM Student Behavioral Standards policy and will be treated as a separate disciplinary matter by the school.

- IX. A description of programming aimed at the prevention of sex offenses, procedures to follow when a sex offense occurs, and the list of sanctions that may be imposed.

Sexual Harassment Identification and Prevention Programming

AUM educates the community about sexual harassment identification and prevention through programs sponsored at least every other year by the University's Human Resource Department.

Procedures to follow in the event of a sexual assault

If you are a victim of a sexual assault at this institution, your first priority should be to get to a place of safety. You should then obtain the necessary medical treatment. The Campus Security Office strongly advocates that a victim of sexual assault report the incident in a timely manner. Time is a critical factor for evidence collection and preservation. An assault should be reported directly to a University officer or to any Antioch employee, who will assist the victim in reporting the assault to the Campus Security officer. Filing a report with the Campus Security Office will not obligate the victim to prosecute, nor will it subject the victim to scrutiny or judgmental opinions from officers. Filing a police report will:

- Ensure that a victim of sexual assault receives the necessary medical treatment and tests, at no expense to the victim.
- Provide the opportunity for collection of evidence helpful in prosecution, which cannot be obtained later (ideally a victim of sexual assault should not wash, douche, use the toilet, or change clothing prior to a medical exam).
- Assure the victim has access to free confidential counseling from counselors specifically trained in the area of sexual assault crisis intervention.

The University will assist you in notifying these authorities if you request assistance.

Institutional responses to a reported sexual assault

When a sexual assault victim contacts the Campus Security, the Yellow Springs Police Department will be notified as well. The victim of a sexual assault may choose for the investigation to be pursued through the criminal justice system.

The Yellow Springs Police Department will guide the victim through the available options and support the victim in her or his decision.

University disciplinary proceedings are detailed in the Antioch University Midwest policy on Behavioral Standards of Conduct, available through the *AUM Catalog* and on the Antioch University Midwest website at http://midwest.antioch.edu/sas/registrar/policies/administrative/aum_behavioral_standards_policy.html. Both the victim and accused will be informed of the outcome of the hearing. A student found guilty of violating the Behavioral Standards policy through sexual misconduct could be criminally prosecuted in the state courts and may be dismissed from the University for a first offense.

Student victims have the option to change their academic schedule after an alleged sexual assault.

Information regarding registered sex offenders in the vicinity of Antioch University Midwest.

The Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act (CSCPA) of 2000 is a federal law that provides for the tracking of convicted sex offenders enrolled at, or employed by, institutions of higher education. The CSCPA is an amendment to the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Act. Federal law requires state law enforcement agencies to provide institutions of higher education with a list of registered sex offenders who indicate that they are enrolled at or employed by those institutions. This list is available from the campus security officer.

The CSCPA further amends the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) to clarify that nothing in the Act can prohibit an educational institution from disclosing information provided to the institution concerning registered sex offenders.

This statement is provided in compliance with the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000.
